- f) Students must complete two prerequisite courses at the introductory level, and the taking of such courses is subject to academic advising and prior approval of the Department of Psychology. First and foremost, these 12 credits must be utilized to fulfill the prerequisite requirements of "Disciplinary Electives", and also to ensure that all components of the major are academically coherent.
5. The core courses PSYC2066 and PSYC2067 will be offered in alternating years. Students may take the core course PSYC2066 in Year III and PSYC2067 in Year IV, subject to the course offering.
6. For selection of disciplinary electives, students should select at least one course that is not from the Department of Psychology. Each course carries 6 credits, however, if students take PSYC4101 Thesis in neuroscience, the course carries 12 credits
