Students in this curriculum may choose to major in one of the five core disciplines: China Studies, Geography, Politics and Public Administration, Social Policy and Social Development, and Sociology. Students may also opt for a double major in multidisciplinary options such as Cognitive Science, Counselling, Criminology, Media and Cultural Studies, Neuroscience, Psychology, Urban Governance and other majors offered by the University. Students can choose to combine a major with one or two minors.

 - Each course carries 6 credits, unless specified otherwise.
 - Students are requested to select not more than two courses from each area of inquiry.
 - Students are requested to choose the introductory pre-requisites courses offered by the core departments under the Faculty, excluding your major department. Please refer to the BPsych/BSocSc programme syllabus at the Faculty website for detailed requirements.
 - BPsych students are requested to complete 12 credits of Social Innovation Requirement and 12 credits of Global Citizenship Requirement.
FOSS2018 Social Innovation internship (12 credits) or PSYC2075 Field placement;
FOSS2019 Global Citizenship internship (12 credits), or a combination of two 6-credit endorsed experiential learning courses, or undertake 12 credits of advanced courses on exchange studies or on an overseas summer programme approved by the Faculty.
 - Students should bear in mind the pre-requisite requirements for courses listed in the "Disciplinary Electives" (See below courses), and take the relevant requisite courses as necessary. Students are reminded to take note that you may need to use 6 to 18 credits for taking relevant pre-requisite(s) which are counted as free elective(s) outside neuroscience curriculum. However, if you have already completed the pre-requisite(s) concerned at you first major, the implication of pre-requisite requirements in Neuroscience Major on students' course selection and study load would be minimized.

b) Pre-requisites of BBMS3011: BBMS1001/BIOL1110/BIOC2600/BIOL2220/BMED2302/PSYC2101/PSYC2110 [(Pre-requisite of BIOC2600: BIOC1600/BIOL1110/ENGG1207/BMED1207) & (Pre-requisite of BIOL2220: BIOL1110)]
c) Pre-requisite of BBMS2003: BBMS1001/BIOC1600
d) Pre-requisite of BMED3501: BMED2500/ELEC3241
e) Pre-requisites of PSYC4101 Thesis in neuroscience: PSYC2060# and PSYC2101-Foundation of neuroscience (Pre-requisites of PSYC2060: PSYC1001 and PSYC1004)
[#A waiver on pre-requisite course (PSYC2060) will be granted for students taking [PSYC4101 Thesis in neuroscience] if the students have taken similar research methods course in their first major (equivalent to PSYC2060). Students shall approach the Department of Psychology for application.]
f) Students must complete two prerequisite courses at the introductory level, and the taking of such courses is subject to academic advising and prior approval of the Department of Psychology. First and foremost, these 12 credits must be utilized to fulfill the prerequisite requirements of "Disciplinary Electives", and also to ensure that all components of the major are academically coherent.
 - For selection of disciplinary electives, students should select at least one course that is not from the Department of Psychology. Each course carries 6 credits, however, if students take PSYC4101 Thesis in neuroscience, the course carries 12 credits
 - The core courses PSYC2066 and PSYC2067 will be offered in alternating years. Students may take the core course PSYC2066 in Year III and PSYC2067 in Year IV, subject to the course offering.
 - For BSocSc students majoring in Psychology, please refer to the BPsych programme syllabus at the Faculty website for detailed requirements.
